### Covid-19 Vaccination Programme – Patient Information

When you are invited by your GP Practice, please attend the One Ellesmere Port Covid-19 Vaccination Centre at:

**Ellesmere Port Civic Hall, Civic Way, Ellesmere Port, CH65 0AZ.**

**Please note the following important information:**

- On the day if you feel unwell or experience COVID-19 (Coronavirus) like symptoms do not attend. Please contact your surgery and they will re-book your appointment.
- Please do not arrive early, there is no waiting area and we need to reduce the number of people in the building in order to socially distance.
- Please bring your own mask or appropriate face covering. If you don't have one, there will be a mask for you to wear during your vaccination.
- Please use the toilet before you attend. There are no toilet facilities on site for patients for infection prevention control measures.

**When you arrive:**

- Please follow directions to the entrance and if required, enter the queue whilst maintaining social distancing
- At the door staff will ask you which GP Practice you are registered with and you will be handed your personalised barcode letter for you to hand to the clinician administering your vaccination. Please read the information on the letter.
- You will be directed to the vaccination room and in line for one of the vaccination stations. When at the vaccination station you will be seen by the clinician administering the vaccine and you will be told of any risks and benefits as known by the Department of Health.
- You will be asked for your consent to administer the vaccine (this can be implied consent as you have arrived for your appointment).
- After your vaccination, you will be directed to the main hall where you are advised to wait for 15 minutes before leaving.

We thank you for your support in the delivery of our vaccination programme. Please also continue to wear a face covering and follow social distancing and hand hygiene guidance as, until a vaccine has been fully rolled out, this is the most effective way to reduce transmission of the virus and help save lives.
